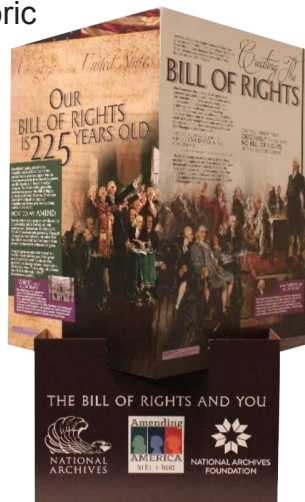
## ***The Bill of Rights and You***

The Marion County Public Library is hosting a new pop-up exhibition from the National Archives, ***The Bill of Rights and You***, commemorating the 225th anniversary of the ratification of this landmark document.

*The Bill of Rights and You* spotlights one of the most remarkable periods in American history, explores the origins of the first ten amendments to the U.S. Constitution (collectively known as the Bill of Rights),

illustrates how each amendment protects U.S. citizens, and looks at how Americans exercise the rights outlined in the amendments.

*The Bill of Rights and You* invites visitors to connect directly with the people, places, and events that mark this historic document's evolution. This exhibit runs through February 28 in the upstairs lobby. Be on the lookout for visits to Fairview and Mannington!

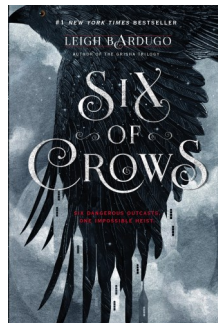


## Toddler Time

## Adult Craft Class



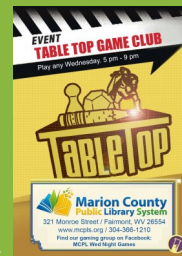

## Wednesday Night Tabletop Game Group

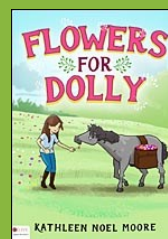

### Children's Author Kathleen Noel Moore



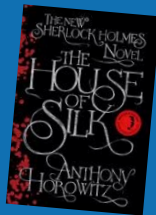
Mark your calendars for Saturday, February 4, when we will welcome children's author Kathleen Noel Moore from 1 pm - 3 pm in the children's room.

Her book, *Flowers for Dolly* tells the heartwarming story of a little girl that longs for a horse of her very own. The public is welcome and refreshments will be provided.



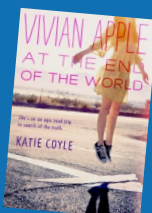
# Readers Recommend

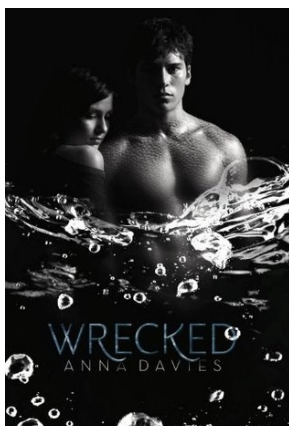

The laotong, Snow Flower, introduces herself by sending Lily a silk fan on which she's written a poem in nu shu, a unique language that Chinese women created in order to communicate in secret, away from the influence of men.

As the years pass, Lily and Snow Flower send messages on the fan and compose stories on handkerchiefs, reaching out of isolation to share their hopes, dreams, and accomplishments. Together they endure the agony of footbinding and reflect upon their arranged marriages, their loneliness, and the joys and tragedies of motherhood. The two find solace in their friendship, developing a bond that keeps their spirits alive. But when a misunderstanding arises, their relationship suddenly threatens to tear apart —Amazon
