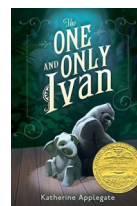
Adult Craft Class

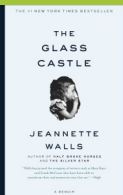

Adult Crafternoon



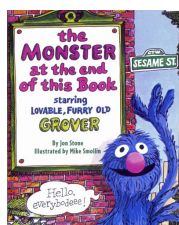

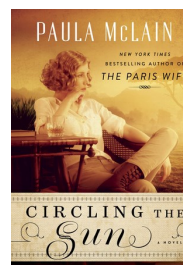
A Bounty of Books

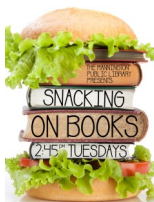
Story Time & Toddler Time

Van Gogh & Goodies

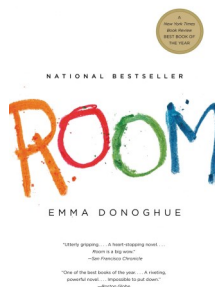

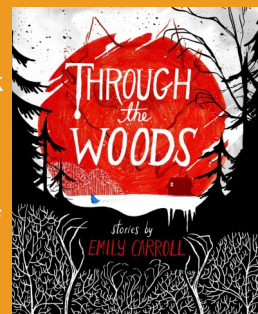


Blackshere "Pizza Parties": 2nd Grade

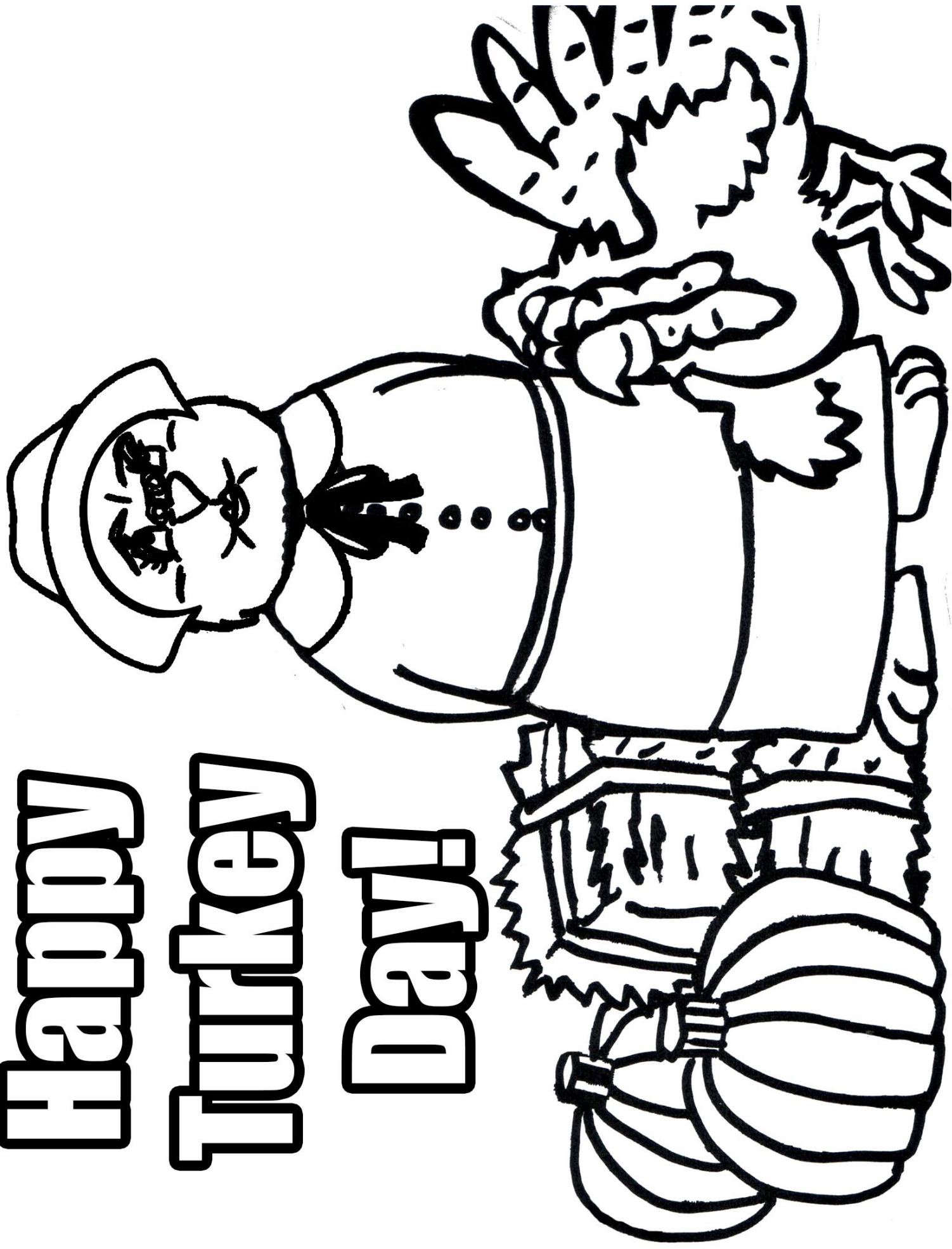
