December is Read a New Book Month. The Marion County Public Library System is overflowing with creative ways to get you started. All branches offer book clubs that challenge you to read titles and authors you may not have chosen on your own. The clubs generally run all year, taking a break only during December. New members are welcome, and books can be signed out a month in advance of the discussion dates to give ample time to complete each selection. Marion

County Public Library offers a teen book club and allows participants to keep their monthly selections.

Another great way to get yourself started on a new book is the Secret Santa Reading Challenge going on during December at the Fairview Public Library. Books will be available to check out at the library, but will be wrapped and placed under the Christmas tree. You won't know what you have till you get it home and unwrap it. For each Secret Santa title you check out, read, and review, you will be entered into a drawing for a Visa gift card to be awarded on December 20th. The more you read, the better your chance of winning!

RECOMMENDED AWARD-WINNING FILMS SERIES, #2

In this second article of my film series, I would like to draw your attention to two visually stunning stories. The 2013 Oscar winning *Life of Pi* follows the physical struggle and spiritual journey of Pi Patel as he and his family set sail to America. When the ship sinks, Pi and his unlikely partner on a small lifeboat must compromise and learn to live with each other if they are going to survive. A winner for visual effects and cinematography, this movie is a beautiful depiction of the novel and brings the story to heart through the senses.

Another must see movie for a stunning adaptation of a noel is *Anna Karenina*. Tolstoy's classic is brought to photographic life in the retelling of aristocrat Anna Karenina's torrid affair that leads to life altering conclusions. Although the cinematic approach is dreamlike and sometimes confusing, the 2013 Oscar winner in Costume Design is well deserved, a feast for the eyes. Both movies take advantage of talented cinematographers, skilled designers, and artful directors. Although both films are adapted from novels, they offer a beautiful reflection of each story's themes and insights that hint of reasons why reading them would be a great idea.

Library Welcomes Artwork of Raymond Stoker and Andrew C. Lyons

During the Month of January, the Marion County Public Library exhibition room will be the site of selected works by local artist Raymond Stoker and architect Andrew C. Lyons. On loan from WVU's MPA instructor Mr. Raymond Alvarez, the collection showcases the works of these native West Virginians.

Raymond Stoker moved to Fairmont in the 1920s, becoming a leading artistic figure, painter, and portrait photographer in the area. Andrew C. Lyons moved to Fairmont in 1892. After successfully opening his architecture firm, Lyons participated in the design of many buildings that still exist today. http://tinyurl.com/kjrtzyz.

The exhibition will be available for viewing during regular library hours through the month of January, 2014.
