Not to mention, the APP lists all of our locations addresses, phone numbers, and hours for your convenience. Don't forget to check out the bookmobile schedule, as well. Thanks to a man named Carter G. Woodson, a Harvard graduate, and minister Jesse E. Moorland, the lives and contributions of African Americans have taken their rightful place in our country's history.

Black History month was begun as Negro History Week during the second week of February, 1926 by the Association for the Study of Negro Life, co-founded by Carter G. Woodson and Jesse E. Morrland. Woodson realized that history books predominantly featured the accomplishments of the white population, but there was very little mention of the African American population.

Over the next several decades, awareness of African American contributions increased. In 1976, President Gerald R. Ford officially named the month of February as Black History Month, encouraging everyone to honor the accomplishments of black Americans.



The Marion County Public Library will be honoring the accomplishments of two African American military groups this month with programs on the Wereth 11 and the Tuskegee Airmen. Check out the Fairmont page in this month's newsletter for more information.



Adult Craft Class



Speaking of Books will meet February 24 to discuss *Red Helmet* by Homer Hickam.



When Wendy Everly was six years old, her mother was convinced she




