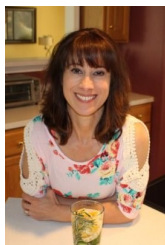

Friends Book Sale

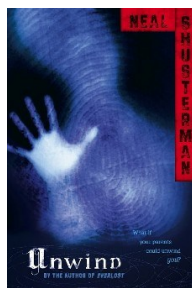

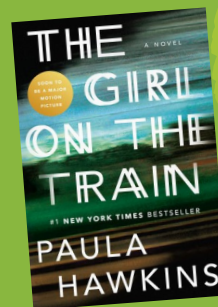
Adult Craft Class

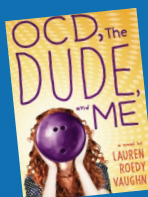

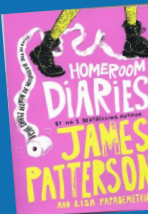


"Teen Read Week" is October 9- 15 and features "Read for the Fun of It." A variety of YA titles

Tim Wynne-Jones, *Eleanor & Park* by Rainbow Rowell, and *Homeroom Diaries* by James Patterson.

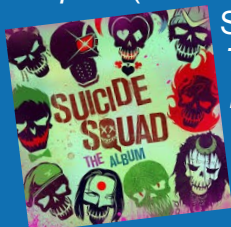


Rocktober

Are You Afraid of the Dark?

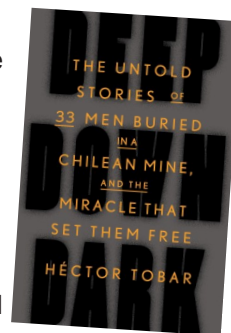

Speaking of Books will meet October 25 at 4 pm to discuss *Deep Down Dark* by Héctor Tobar.

When the San José mine collapsed outside of Copiapó, Chile, in August 2010, it trapped thirty-three miners beneath thousands of feet of rock for a record-breaking sixty-nine days. The entire world watched what transpired above-ground during the grueling and protracted rescue, but the saga of the miners' experiences below the Earth's surface—and the lives that led them there—has never been heard until now.



Even while still buried, they all agreed that if by some miracle any of them escaped alive, they would share their story only collectively. Héctor Tobar was the person they chose to hear, and now to tell, that story. Working in such a dangerous place. In its stirring final chapters, it captures the profound way in which the lives of everyone involved in the disaster were forever changed.

Story Time & Toddler Time

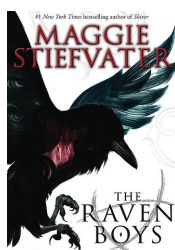

The Fiction Addiction Teen Book Club will meet Monday, October 17 @ 4:30 pm. This month's title is *The Raven Boys* by Maggie Stiefvater.

Every year, Blue Sargent stands next to her clairvoyant mother as the soon-to-be dead walk past. Blue never sees them--until this year, when a boy emerges from the dark and speaks to her.

His name is Gansey, a rich student at Aglionby, the local private school. Blue has a policy of staying away from Aglionby boys. Known as Raven Boys, they can only mean trouble.

But Blue is drawn to Gansey, in a way she can't entirely explain. He is on a quest that has encompassed three other Raven Boys: Adam, the scholarship student who resents the privilege around him; Ronan, the fierce soul whose emotions range from anger to despair; and Noah, the taciturn watcher who notices many things but says very little.

For as long as she can remember, Blue has been warned that she will cause her true love to die. She doesn't believe in true love, and never thought this would be a problem. But as her life becomes caught up in the strange and sinister world of the Raven Boys, she's not so sure anymore.

Blackshere "Pizza Parties"

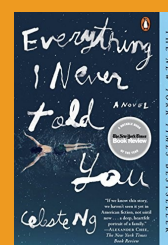
