Library Card Sign-up Month!

Every parent wants their child to succeed, and one of the simplest ways you can ensure your child's academic success is by making a quick trip to the library. September is Library Card Signup Month, a time when the Marion County Public Library System joins with the American Library Association and public libraries nationwide to make sure that every student has the most important school supply of all—a free library card.

Resources at the library are available to anyone who has a library card. Students can turn to the library for materials, programs, and services that support academic achievement. Students can use their library card at home, too. Our library offers access to important educational resources, like EBSCO Host, Points of View Reference Center, LearningExpressLibrary, Searchasaurus, Grolier Online,

Novelist and Novelist Plus. The library also offers free access to digital downloads of ebooks, music, classic audiobooks, and magazines with WVDELI, Freegal, One Click Digital, and Zinio.

During the month of September, anyone signing up for a library card at the Marion County Public Library will receive a free book light while supplies last. You can also enter ALA's national contest. Share why you value your library card using our Library Card Sign-up Month word balloons (provided at your library), or create your own!. 


