




Adults can test their knowledge on September 24th from 9 am-4 pm with our monthly trivia contest, "What Do You Know about That?" and win a prize.


September's feature presentation is Paul Blart, Mall Cop 2, starring Kevin James, Raini Rodriguez, and Eduardo Verástegui; rated PG.
