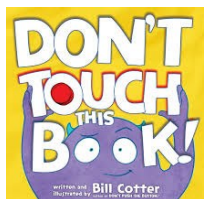
Raise a Glass

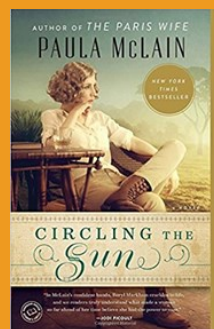
