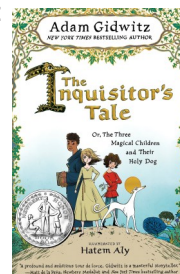

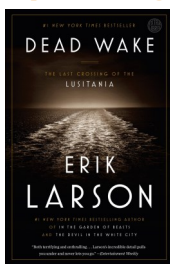

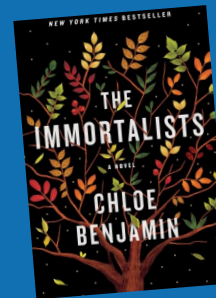
What Do You Know About That? Trivia Contest

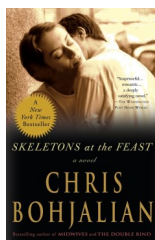
