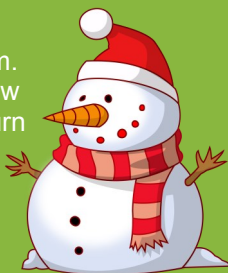


## Family Fun Holiday

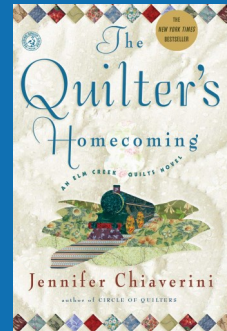
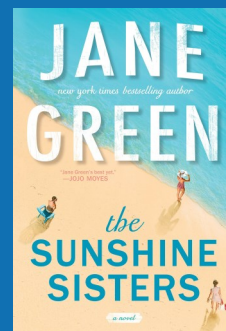
## Cozying up to Christmas

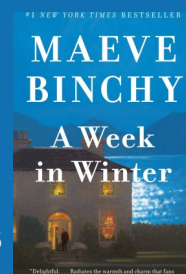
## What Do You Know About That? Trivia Contest

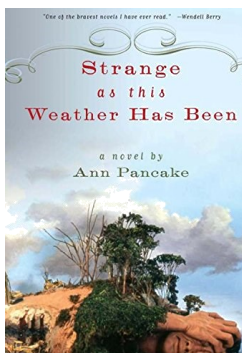
