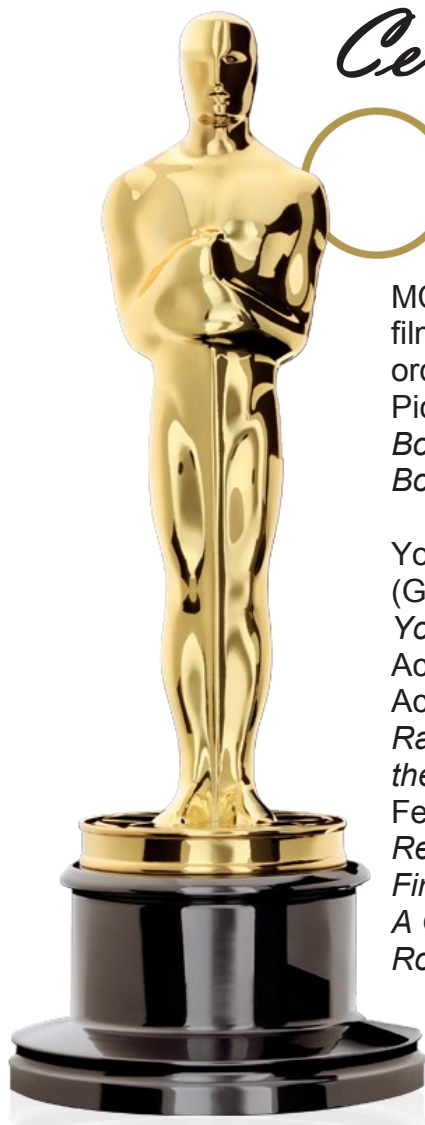

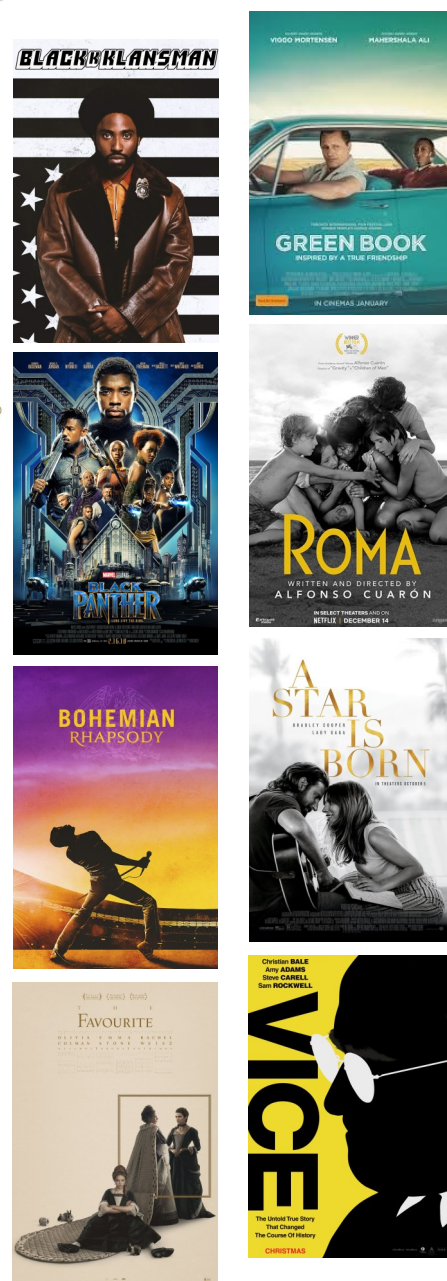


Celebrate THE OSCARS

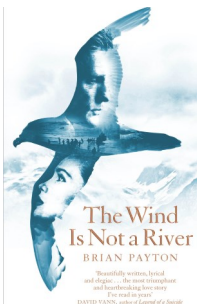
Gardening Q&A

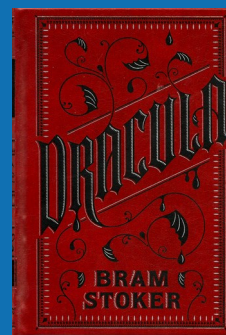
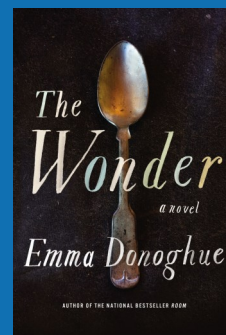


Our monthly book club, "Speaking of Books," returns on March 26 at 4 pm to review *The Wind is Not a River* by Brian Payton.

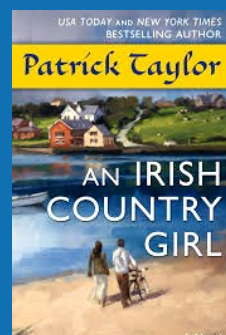
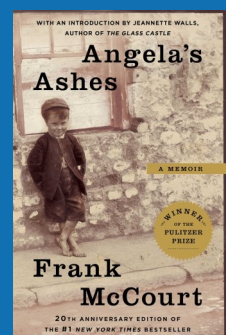
