




## SPACE INSPIRED BOARD BOOKS

- **8 Little Planets by Chris Ferrie** To the tune of "Ten Little Monkeys Jumping on the Bed" comes a new bedtime story from bestselling author Chris Ferrie that's sure to get little ones excited about the solar system while learning new facts about each planet!
- ABCs of Space by Chris Ferrie Introduces a topic of astronomy for every letter of the alphabet, from asteroids to zenith.
- Astro Pea by Amalia Hoffman Imagine what would happen if fresh veggies could go on a cosmic adventure Well, blast off with Pete the pea and find out what he discovers outside his pod. Pete joins other curiously shaped vegetables such as an eggplant, artichoke, cauliflower, ear of corn, and mushroom as they each take a starring role in this creative tale of space exploration, daring, and friendship. Who knew healthy food could be so much fun? Let your imagination run to space and back as ordinary vegetables take on a whole new meaning.

- Astronaut Handbook by Meghan McCarthy Journey aboard the "Vomit Comet" where the students of an astronaut school learn what it is like to do this exciting job by experiencing weightlessness, getting their measurements taken for a space suit, and performing a space walk.
- Chicken in Space by Adam Lehrhaupt An adventurous chicken and her pig friend travel to what they believe is outer space, fueled by their imaginations.





- Ada Lace, Take Me to Your Leader by Emily Calandrelli Third grader and inventor extraordinaire Ada Lace likes nothing more than to tinker with mechanics like her robot, George. Her latest project is to fix up a ham radio, something that she could use to contact people on this planet... and beyond. The only problem is that she just can't get it to work properly. During a sleepover, Ada's best friend Nina hears something strange coming from the radio in the middle of the night. A distant voice says, "Release the swarm!" convincing Nina that aliens are about to invade planet Earth. Could Ada and Nina have stumbled upon something...extraterrestrial?
- Close Encounters of the Nerd Kind by Jeff Miller Eagerly agreeing to help NASA after tiring of simulated flying games, thirteen-year-old supernerd Neil and his friends head into outer space to reclaim a stolen super-secret spacecraft.

There's no shortage of suspects, so Dash recruits two tech-savvy new friends to help with his investigation, never forgetting that they might be trapped in space with a killer.
- **Zombie Butts from Uranus by Andy Griffiths** In the deepest, darkest corner of the solar system lies an enemy more terrifying than the people of Earth could imagine. Vicious warriors who will let nothing stand in the way of their crusade for galactic domination. They're cunning. They're ruthless. They're zombie butts from Uranus! Earth has only one hope for salvation. Zack, a twelve-year-old who wants nothing more than to wash his hands of the whole butt-fighting business.

- Circus Galacticus by Deva Fagan Trix's life in boarding school as an orphan charity case
  has been hard but when an alluring young Ringmaster invites her, a gymnast, to join Circus
  Galacticus she gains an entire universe of deadly enemies and potential friends, along with a
  chance to unravel secrets of her own past.
- **Defy the Stars** by Claudia Gray Teenaged soldier Noemi and an enemy robot, Abel, who is programmed to obey her commands, set out on an interstellar quest to save her home planet, Earth colony Genesis.
- **The Diabolic** by **S.J. Kincaid** Star Wars meets The Hunger Games in this epic novel about what happens when a senator's daughter is summoned to the galactic court as a hostage who's really the galaxy's most dangerous weapon in disguise.

- **Waste of Space** by Gina Damico A raucous account of ten teenagers picked to live on a rocket ship, get shot into space, and have their adventures broadcast live to the entire world. Find out what happens when reality stops being reality, and everything goes inevitably, horribly wrong.

## SPACE INSPIRED FICTION

- Amish Vampires in Space by Kerry Nietz Jebediah has a secret that will change his
  world forever and send his people into space. The Amish world of Alabaster calls upon an
  ancient promise to escape destruction. Then end up on a cargo ship bound for the stars.
  But they are not the only cargo on board. Some of it is alive...or used to be. Now, with
  vampires taking over and closing in on the Amish refugees, these simple believers must
  decide whether their faith depends upon their honored traditions or something even older.
- **Conquest by John Connolly** Depicts a world where humanity has been conquered by oppressive alien forces and where a group of increasingly powerful young rebels is assisted by an alien ruler's daughter, who risks her life after falling in love with a human.
- Dark Matter by Blake Crouch A mind-bending, relentlessly paced science-fiction thriller, in which an ordinary man is kidnapped, knocked unconscious--and awakens in a world inexplicably different from the reality he thought he knew.
- Gravity by Tess Gerritsen A space station crew has been infected by a deadly
  organism and hope of a rescue is abandoned for fear of the contagion infecting earth's
  population.
- Into Everywhere by Paul McAuley The Jackaroo gave humanity access to alien worlds and technologies, yet we still know nothing about them. As humanity spreads wider into the universe, will we discover what secrets they are hiding?
- The Long Way to a Small, Angry Planet by Becky Chambers Follow a motley crew on an exciting journey through space-and one adventurous young explorer who discovers the meaning of family in the far reaches of the universe-in this light-hearted debut space opera from a rising sci-fi star.
- Out of the Silent Planet by C.S. Lewis Dr. Ransom is kidnapped and spirited by spaceship to the mysterious red planet of Malacandra. He escapes and goes on the run, jeopardizing both his chances of ever returning to Earth and his very life.
- **Spaceman of Bohemia** by Jaroslav Kalfar Raised by his grandparents on the Czech countryside and rising to the country's first astronaut, Jakub abandons his wife to atone for his father's sins as a Communist informer by accepting a dangerous solo mission to Venus and encounters fantastical, philosophical elements before clashing with Russian rivals.
- An Unkindness of Ghosts by Kerry Nietz Aster lives in the lowdeck slums of the HSS Matilda, a space vessel organized much like the antebellum South. For generations, Matilda has ferried the last of humanity to a mythical Promised Land. On its way, the ship's leaders have imposed harsh moral restrictions and deep indignities on dark-skinned sharecroppers like Aster. Embroiled in a grudge with a brutal overseer, Aster learns there may be a way to improve her lot--if she's willing to sow the seeds of civil war.
- **The Wanderers** by Meg Howrey Station Eleven meets The Martian in this brilliantly inventive and timely novel about three astronauts training to be the first humans on Mars; a sharply observed story of ambition, endeavour and family.





- America in Space: NASA's First Fifty Years A visual history of NASA's many achievements in manned and unmanned space travel, written by a team of experienced NASA staffers and illustrated with more than 400 images, many of which are previously unpublished photographs from NASA archives.
- An Astronaut's Guide to Life on Earth by Chris Hadfield An Astronaut's Guide to Life on Earth is an inspirational memoir of space exploration and hard-won wisdom, from an astronaut who has spent a lifetime making the impossible a reality
- The Astronaut Wives Club by Lily Koppel With selection of the first crew members of the Mercury space program in 1959, a small group of women who had been ordinary military wives became celebrities. As role models and representatives of the space program, NASA demanded their perfection, from their clothing to the meals they served at home. This intimate, informative group portrait chronicles how they formed a support group and became an essential resource.
- Endurance: a year in space, a lifetime of discovery by Scott Kelly A memoir by the astronaut who spent a record-breaking year aboard the International Space Station shares candid reminiscences of his voyage, his colorful formative years, and the off-planet journeys that shaped his early career.
- Falling to Earth: an Apollo 15 astronaut's journey by Al Worden The author describes his life, from his early years growing up on a farm to his years as an astronaut with NASA, including flying the Apollo 15 mission to the moon in 1971.
- Hidden Figures: the American dream and the untold story of the Black women mathematicians who helped win the space race by Margot Lee Shetterly An account of the previously unheralded but pivotal contributions of NASA's African-American women mathematicians to America's space program describes how they were segregated from their white counterparts by Jim Crow laws in spite of their groundbreaking successes.
- Packing for Mars by Mary Roach Describes the weirdness of space travel. answers questions about the long-term effects of living in zero gravity on the human body, and explains how space simulations on Earth can provide a preview to life in space.
- Riding rockets: the outrageous tales of a space shuttle astronaut by R. Mike Mullane Decorated fly-boy, combat veteran, and International Space Hall -of-Famer Colonel Mike Mullane delivers a bright and revealing memoir of his life as an astronaut--the first book of its kind to take a close look at NASAUs space shuttle program. - Sally Ride: America's First Woman in Space by Lynn Sherr This is the definitive biography of Sally Ride, America's first woman in space, with exclusive insights from Ride's family and partner, by the ABC reporter who covered NASA
