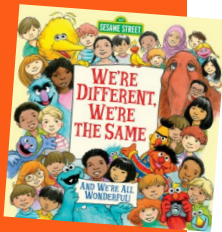

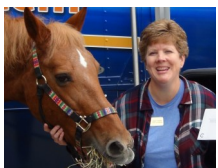

will need a sewing needle, pencil, and the practice guide print out.

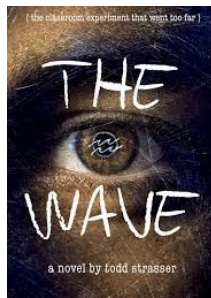

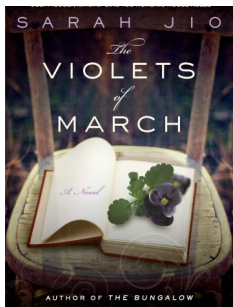

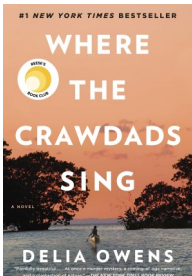
