Incarcerating Women (Adult) Monday, November 7 | 7:00 p.m.

There are more than one million women behind bars or under the control of the criminal 'justice' system in the United States today. Women are the fastest growing segment of the incarcerated population, increasing at nearly double the rate of men since 1985. This presentation by Dr. Jeri Kirby of Fairmont State University and Dr. Mandy Sanchez of the international non-profit organization Culture Reframed, will highlight how, over the past 20 years, the nation's War on Drugs has contributed to this phenomenon. Other topics include the challenges women who are incarcerated face inside, such as: histories of trauma and victimization, mothering from prison, mental illness, substance abuse, and lack of vocational and educational programming inside. We will also discuss challenges women face upon re-entry and conclude with a call for greater understanding and stigma reduction practices to assist the many women who will be releasing into our communities
