Crafts with Creativebug:

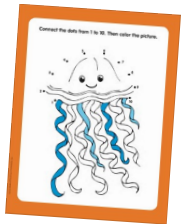

Adult Painting Class

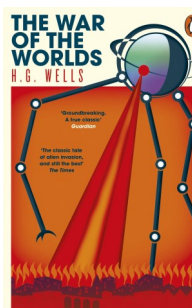
Join us on social media July 17 at 3 pm to learn how to create a whimsical painting of hope with Julie Mike.

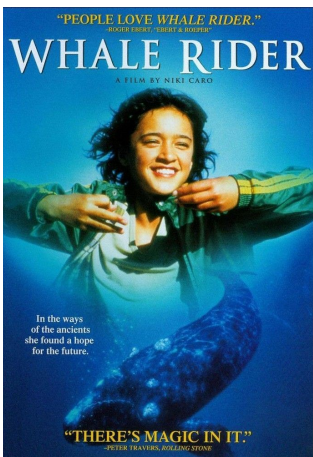


Friday Night Flicks

MCPL's Wednesday Night Game Group is also part of the WV Nerd Herd, North Central WV's Boardgaming Community.

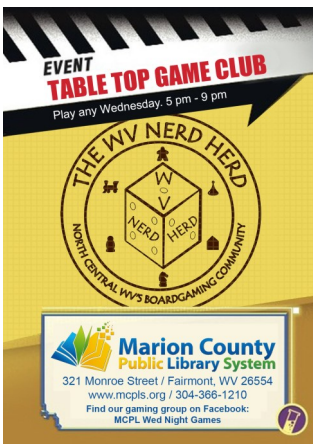
