LIBRARY CARD SIGN UP MONTH

September is Library Card Sign Up Month, and we're so thankful for all of our cardholders!

If you have a friend who needs a card, did you know that they can sign up for a card through the Marion County Public Library app?

We'll review the application and mail them a card! They just need their WV photo ID and proof of address. It's that easy!

NEW: WHITE HALL EXPRESS HOLDS

You asked, and we made it happen- patrons are now able to put items on hold to be picked up at the White Hall Express Kiosk!

There are two ways for patrons to accomplish this:

1. Log into their account through the search the collection link on the MCPLS website* and choose White Hall Express as the pick-up location, from the drop down menu.
2. Have circulation staff put items on hold for them either in-person or via a phone call.

When the hold is ready to be picked up at the White Hall Express, patrons will receive a notification via their arrived hold notice choice (email or phone).

When a patron picks up a hold at the White Hall Express, they will scan their card and enter their PIN. A message pops up saying they have holds.

The machine will dispense the holds first and then ask if they would like to check out more items. Hold will remain in the White Hall Express for 5 days.

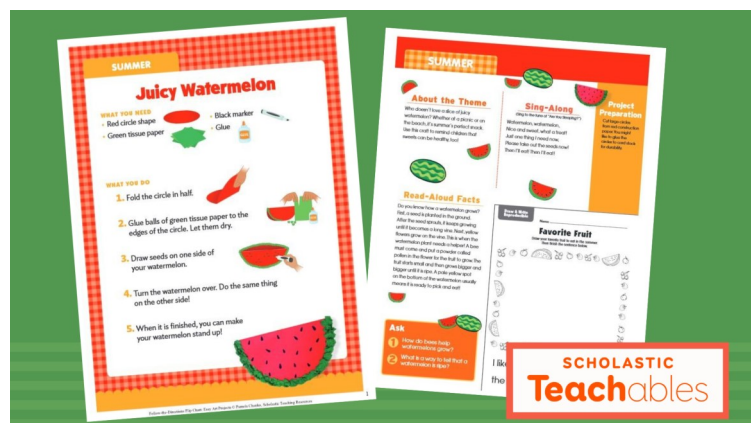

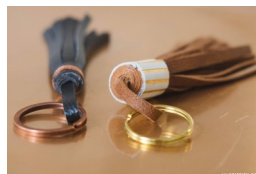

Faux Leather Tassel Keychain

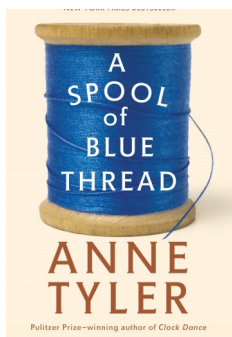

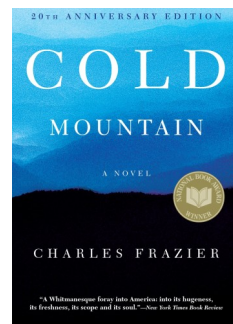


Beyond the Book Club
