NEW: Self Check Out Kiosk

If you've been in the lobby of the Marion County Public Library (Fairmont) recently, you might have noticed a new addition in the lobby!

After running an interest survey, we added a free standing self check out kiosk for those who might be in a hurry (especially on hectic library event days!), wish to have privacy for their checkouts, or prefer to avoid social interaction.

Simply scan your library card, select "check out," then place your library materials on the flat surface. Like our traditional work stations, the self check out uses RFID technology to scan each item. You can renew eligible items and choose to print or email your receipt!



There are also multiple language options, and it has the ability to increase font size and screen contrast.

We look forward to sharing the check out kiosk with you!

Important note: This self check out kiosk is to supplement our services, and will not decrease the amount of staff hired at any of our locations.
