

In the past MCPLS bought access to Hoopla Digital's collection, but we couldn't add titles that weren't included. Now with Hoopla Flex, we will be able to purchase popular titles to add.


Like WVDeli, you may need to place a hold. Also similar to WVDeli, you can have up to 10 Hoopla Flex items at a time. They don't count toward your regular Hoopla checkouts. You can tell Flex titles because of this logo on the cover.

RBDigital has also merged with Overdrive, the company behind our popular WVDeli Service. RBDigital Services are moving over to the WVDeli platform at the website and via the Libby App (or the Overdrive App for Kindle Users). Audiobooks and magazines at RBDigital have been added into our WVDeli collection.

The online music lessons from ArtistWorks will also move over, but a specific date has not yet been announced.

can be taken to prevent it."


