Linda started her MCPLS journey as a part time clerk and then a cataloger before making the jump to branch manager in 2012! We will miss Linda and are thankful for her years of service!


WELCOME, JANET!


Beyond the Book Presents*: Don't Let the Tail Wag the Family, featuring Joe Gribben Tuesday, June 29 at 7 pm





friends, and a brilliant journalism career culminating in his twenty-two years as anchor of the NBC Nightly News and as bestselling author. But in the summer of 2013, when back pain led him to the doctors at the Mayo Clinic, his run of good luck was interrupted. He received shocking news: He had multiple myeloma, a treatable but incurable blood cancer. Friends had always referred to Brokaw's "lucky star," but as he writes in this inspiring memoir, "Turns out that star has a dimmer switch."

Brokaw takes us through all the seasons and stages of this surprising year, the emotions, discoveries, setbacks, and struggles—times of denial, acceptance, turning points, and courage.
