

## TIPS & TRICKS FOR A SUCCESSFUL START TO THE SCHOOL YEAR

**Touch base with your child's future teachers**. Reach out to the teacher(s) in person, or at the very least, sent an email to introduce yourself and establish a relationship with the teacher(s) before the school year begins.

Attend any orientations together. Usually, before the school year begins, there are school orientations for parents and students. These are good opportunities for you to meet your child's teachers and administrators in person and also for your child to get a feel for the school before classes actually start.

**Reconnect with other parents**. Reach out to the parents of your child's school friends. It never hurts to offer a helping hand or ask for help early on so that you know who you can turn to during the school year.

**Establish before**-*l***after**-**school plans**. Will your child come home by himself or herself? If so, do you have a "check-in" time for him or her to reach out to you while you're at work? Do you need to arrange transportation to go somewhere after school? Hash out the details with your child so that you're on the same page.

**Read to your child**. While most parents read to their child as babies or in the younger elementary school days, did you know that most children ages 6 to 11 still enjoy readaloud time? Continue that daily routine with your older child. Source: www.blog.edmentum.com


